Here are some things that you should have in your family emergency plan and kit.



Non-perishable Food
Enough for 3-7 days
Include special diets



Cash
Credit/Debit cards do not work without electricity!



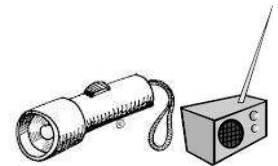
Gallon of water per person per day



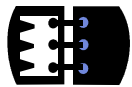
Identification in waterproof container: Drivers license, Social Security card, Health Insurance card, passport



Pet supplies:
Food, water, cage, leash & muzzle, medicine, favorite toys



Basic Supplies:
Flashlight, radio, batteries



Address Book
Contact information for family & friends. Remember, your cell phone cannot be recharged without electricity



Basic Tools



Fill propane tanks for grilling or for generators



Fill all vehicles with fuel



Toiletries, wipes, diapers, elder and/or baby items



Clothing for 3-7 days
Include a raincoat, extra shoes & socks



Medicine for everyone:
Prescriptions, vitamins, over-the-counter medicines, pet medicines.



Choose an out of town family contact



Spare Keys
For vehicles and your home



Important papers in waterproof container: Insurance and health records, doctors orders, bank account, pictures or video of belongings



Blankets, pillows, comfort items



Bleach and general cleaning supplies



First Aid Kit



Entertainment toys, books, quiet games
